a quality or state of being generally known and talked about

After the trial, Bob Ewell's job "only lasted as long as his *notoriety*" (332).

irascible

adjective | i•ras•ci•ble (ear-RAS-cuh-bull)

marked by hot temper and easily provoked anger

The mockingbird pours out its melody, "from the shrill kee, kee of the sunflower bird to the *irascible* qua-ack of a bluejay" (342).
