Directions: Choose one of the following prompts and write a 2-3 paragraph response. Each paragraph should have a strong, persuasive topic sentence which addresses the prompt, an assertion that narrows the focus of the topic sentence and sets reader up for the evidence, in the form of at least 2 properly integrated quotes. Quotes should then be followed by sentences of analysis, describing how or why the quote supports the claim rather than just restating the quote.

<u>Prompt #1</u> – Choose one character from *The General Prologue* and explain Chaucer's attitude toward him/her. You should include textual evidence that supports your view including character description (manner of dress, behavior, speech, etc.) and Chaucer's use of irony and satire.

<u>Prompt #2</u> – Chaucer satirizes many of the religious characters as he introduces them in *The General Prologue.* Choose one religious character that he critiques and one he seems to respect and compare/contrast Chaucer's portrayal of each. Why does he praise one and critique the other?
