adj | (punk-TILL-e-us)

marked by or concerned about precise accordance with the details of convention

This quality was continually breaking through his *punctilious* manner in the shape of restlessness. (ch. 4)

contemptuous

adj | (con-TEM-choo-us)

manifesting, feeling, or expressing deep hatred or disapproval; showing contempt He knew women early, and since they spoiled him he became *contemptuous* of them . . . (ch. 6)
