- 3. Citations should be in alphabetical order based on the first word of the citation
- 4. Margins are the same as for essay (1 inch all around), but after 1<sup>st</sup> line of citation, proceeding lines should be indented ½ inch
- 5. Title of Journal article in "quotation marks"
- 6. Name of Journal or title of book in *italics*
- 7. Journal number, volume, date, page number in plain text; book publisher and date in plain text
- 8. Database info in *italics* followed by plain text
