1. Should use same page format (last name and page #) that you use for essay
2. “Works Cited” should be centered, using 12pt Times New Roman font that is set to double-spacing (no extra space, no bold / italics / underline)
3. Citations should be in alphabetical order based on the first word of the citation
4. Margins are the same as for essay (1 inch all around), but after 1<sup>st</sup> line of citation, proceeding lines should be indented ½ inch
5. Title of Journal article in "quotation marks"
6. Name of Journal or title of book in *italics*
7. Journal number, volume, date, page number in plain text; book publisher and date in plain text
8. Database info in *italics* followed by plain text
